


Convocation 2018

Nirupama Rao

Nirupama Menon Rao is a retired Indian diplomat, Foreign Secretary and Ambassador. She was educated in India and joined the Indian Foreign Service in 1973. During her four-decade-long diplomatic career she held several important assignments. She was India's first woman spokesperson in the Ministry of External Affairs, New Delhi, and the first woman High Commissioner from her country to Sri Lanka, and the first Indian woman Ambassador to the People's Republic of China. She served as India's Foreign Secretary from 2009-2011. At the end of that term, she was appointed India's Ambassador to the United States where she served from 2011-2013.

On her retirement from active diplomatic service, Ambassador Rao entered the world of academics with an appointment as Meera and Vikram Gandhi Fellow at the India Initiative at Brown University. She has continued to pursue her academic interests and has taught an undergraduate seminar at Brown University titled "India in the World".

Ambassador Rao holds an honorary Doctor of Letters degree from Pondicherry University in India. She is currently working on a book on India's China relationship, entitled *The Politics of History: India and China*, 1949-1962.

Keynote Speaker

Sheldon Pollock

Sheldon Pollock is the Arvind Raghunathan Professor of South Asian Studies at Columbia University. Earlier he served as the George V. Bobrinskoy Distinguished Service Professor of Sanskrit and Indic Studies at the University of Chicago, where he taught from 1989-2005. He was educated at Harvard University, receiving his undergraduate degree in Classics (Greek) *magna cum laude* in 1971 before earning an MA (1973) and Ph.D. (1975) in Sanskrit and Indian Studies. His areas of specialization are Sanskrit philology, Indian intellectual and literary history, and comparative history.

He is the author and editor of many books, including *The Language of the Gods in the World of Men: Sanskrit, Culture, and Power in Pre-modern India; A Rasa Reader: Classical Indian Aesthetics; What China and India Once Were: The Pasts That May Shape the Global Future; World Philology; Literary Cultures in History: Reconstructions from South Asia.*

He is the Founding General Editor of "The Murty Classical Library of India" (Harvard University Press) and of "Historical Sourcebooks in Classical Indian Thought" (Columbia University Press). He was an Associate and then General Editor of the "Clay Sanskrit Library," for which he also edited and translated a number of volumes, and the founding editor of "South Asia across the Disciplines" (University of California Press, University of Chicago Press, and Columbia University Press).

His honours include the Distinguished Achievement Award from the Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, and the Presidential Certificate of Honour for Sanskrit and the Padma Shri, both from the Government of India. He is a fellow of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

leaders in a diverse and complex world, the kind envisioned by Emperor Ashoka 2000 years ago.


