


A Fellow for Life.


Ever challenged your understanding of the world around you? Try the YIF classroom.





Final Draft: The Journal of YIF Critical Writing

The goal of Final Draft, the annual journal of YIF Critical Writing, is to showcase both the range—in topic and genre—and strength of writing in a student body that is itself highly diverse in terms of its educational, disciplinary, professional, geographic, linguistic, and socio-economic backgrounds. Through the process of writing multiple drafts, student-authors discover their own unique voice, and recognise writing as an ongoing, open-ended activity as signalled by the title of the journal itself. As the Fellows learn to bring critical thinking tools to the drawing board, readers of Final Draft can witness a clear attempt by them to negotiate with texts and social phenomena as they make sense of the world around them.










CSGS was established as an outcome of an ELM project in the YIF 2014-15. The project was on establishing a space for conversations around gender and sexuality at Ashoka University.

Professional Development Workshops



Infrastructure and Facilities




Cultural and Co-Curricular Engagement

Start an Organisation

Apply to the 5-month long holistic *Entrepreneur-in-Residence (EiR)* programme at Ashoka University's *Infoedge Centre for Entrepreneurship* to incubate, develop and test your idea through a support structure that brings together a network of founders, entrepreneurs, mentors and investors. Many alumni have carried forward their ELM projects as *EiRs*. Alumni have developed models to improve cashflow for small businesses, found a way to democratise earning through writing, promoted menstrual hygeine, and more, through the support of the *EiR* programme. Most recently, YourQuote was selected for the prestigious Y-Combinator.




Create Social Impact

Apply to the values-driven 18-month *Mother Teresa Fellowship* programme at Ashoka University's *Centre for Social Impact and Philanthropy*. It allows you to pursue your goals in development by providing you mentorship, professional and personal support, along with a monthly stipend. YIF alumni have started national movements, built gender sensitization programs, shaped institutions that educate underprivileged communities, and empowered communities of farmers, among other pursuits focused on creating meaningful change in society.



Turn your Fellowship into a Master's Degree (MLS)

Extend your stay at Ashoka by a year and graduate with a Master in Liberal Studies (MLS) degree. The interdisciplinary research program is open to Fellows and alumni. Students design their own curriculum, in consultation with their supervisor, and often choose to work on projects across two or more disciplines. They also pursue graduate assistantships. The focus is on nurturing curiosity for intellectual challenges and building skills for research.

When you study anything at YIF, what you're fundamentally doing from a meta-skill perspective, is just trying to understand multiple perspectives. I see that in action everyday on my job. In business to business sales, you're not selling to an individual but an entire organization is selling to another organization. And in big organizations for anything to move, it always takes a village. What really helps in those scenarios is looking at very contentious views and seeing if there can be a way to build consensus. The subjects that I studied at the YIF helped me learn this skill of understanding group dynamics and building consensus in a structured way.





Application Timeline

You can apply only once in the admissions cycle and only in one round. In case you miss deadline for the early decision round, you can finish your application in the final round.



Selection Process (Online)



Eligibility Criteria

The two criteria for eligibility are (1) a recognized undergraduate degree or equivalent (you can be in your final year at the time of application), and, (2) being no more than 28 years of age on 1st August, 2021. You may have work experience and/or a postgraduate credential as well. We welcome applications from all academic, professional, geographic, cultural and socioeconomic backgrounds.

Financial Aid

Ashoka University's need-based Financial Aid programme aims to provide necessary financial support which can help you bridge the gap between the cost of the programme and your ability to pay. Several benefactors, including YIF alumni, have made financial aid possible.

51 %	of Fellows 2020-21 are on some form of need-based financial aid
34%	of Fellows 2020-21 are on more than 50% tuition waivers
68%	of all Fellows to date have been supported through financial aid

Before awarding need-based financial aid to Fellows, we expect that the Fellow and/or their family/guardian(s) will consider various resources available to them towards financing the cost of the YIF programme.

To complement the need-based aid offered to selected candidates, Ashoka University has collaborated with institutions who enable education loans to help cover any gap between the aid offered and the programme fee.



Ashoka University

Ashoka University is a private, non-profit university that commenced operations in 2014. It is a pioneer in its focus on multidisciplinary liberal education, which is usually defined as one that transcends the boundaries between the arts and sciences, and carries a strong emphasis on learning across subjects.

Founders and Historical Context

Ashoka University has over 100 founders, both individuals and organizations, who represent some of India's leading institution builders entrepreneurs, academicians and industry stalwarts. The core founder group comprises Ashish Dhawan (MBA, Harvard Business School), Pramath Raj Sinha (PhD, University of Pennsylvania), Sanjeev Bikhchandani (MBA, IIM Ahmedabad) and Vineet Gupta (BTech, IIT Delhi), who came together in 2008 to conceptualize Ashoka University. They started by launching the Young India Fellowship in 2011, which to this day remains one of India's most sought after postgraduate-level programmes.

Governance Model
