



A Year-long Fellowship. A Fellow for Life.

Started in 2011, the Young India Fellowship (YIF) grooms socially conscious leaders and change-makers for the 21st century. Offered as Ashoka University's flagship residential postgraduate diploma in Liberal Studies, the YIF is unlike any other graduate academic programme. It exposes Fellows to a multidisciplinary and multidimensional curriculum, through which they get access to diverse areas of study, research and practice within a year. This often helps Fellows reimagine themselves and discover or strengthen their areas of interest. It also prepares them to solve complex problems using a multidisciplinary approach, no matter what they do in their lives.

Fellows study a curated selection of about 20 courses taught by renowned educators, work on a team-based project to solve a real-world problem, and learn how to think critically and write effectively. They also engage with and are mentored by inspiring individuals from the Ashoka community and beyond, and live with a diverse community of around 100 exceptional individuals from many walks of life.

Over 2100 individuals from India and abroad have commenced their lifelong journeys as Young India Fellows. They are spread across the world, pursuing impactful careers across development and corporate sectors, government, academia and as entrepreneurs. Many work at some of the world's most aspirational organizations and continue to study on prestigious scholarships at leading academic institutions globally. Fellows keep coming back to the Fellowship, and contribute to shaping and nurturing it further. They continue to support and collaborate with each other and with members of the larger Ashoka ecosystem in their professional and personal pursuits.


Challenge and enhance your understanding of the world around you. Try the YIF classroom.



Final Draft: The Journal of YIF Critical Writing

The goal of Final Draft is to showcase both the range—in topic and genre—and strength of writing in a student body that is itself highly diverse in terms of its educational, disciplinary, professional, geographic, linguistic, and socio-economic backgrounds. Through the process of writing multiple drafts, student-authors discover their own unique voice, and recognise writing as an ongoing, open-ended activity as signalled by the title of the journal itself. As the Fellows learn to bring critical thinking tools to the drawing board, readers of Final Draft can witness a clear attempt by them to negotiate with texts and social phenomena as they make sense of the world around them.








Barefoot Edu started in the YIF 2016-17 to explore teaching and learning in schools. Now incubated at Harvard Innovation Labs in Boston, it is focused on improving school systems and educational leadership.

CSGS was established at Ashoka University as an outcome of an ELM project in the YIF 2014-15. The project was on establishing a space for conversations around gender and sexuality at Ashoka University.



Quidich evolved from an ELM involving a drone that covered the 2014 Indian elections, to a full-fledged tech company, providing cutting-edge solutions for sport broadcast. Their most recent work includes the IPL 2021 and the ICC World Test Championship.


The Crossover Series NEW



Spread over 25 acres (expanding soon to 50 acres) in Rajiv Gandhi Education City, the green campus includes a state-of-the-art library building, hi-tech classrooms, world-class sports infrastructure, common spaces and multiple dining options. Student Support Systems



The Career Development Office (CDO) facilitates campus placements for Ashokans and also organizes a career preparatory program. The CDO also looks for custom opportunities that match specific career interests, and often shares relevant work opportunities with the YIF alumni community as well. The YIF Class of 2022 witnessed a 100% placement season at a median corporate CTC of 10.8LPA, with the highest CTC being 30LPA.



Start an Organization

Apply to the 5-month long **Entrepreneur-in-Residence** (EiR) programme at Ashoka University's *Infoedge Centre for Entrepreneurship* to incubate, develop and test your idea through a support structure that brings together a network of founders, entrepreneurs, mentors and investors. Many alumni have carried forward their ELM projects as *EiRs*. Alumni have developed models to improve cashflow for small businesses, found a way to democratise earning through writing, promoted menstrual hygeine, and more, through the support of the *EiR* programme. Most recently, YourQuote was selected for the prestigious Y-Combinator.



Create Social Impact

Apply to the values-driven 18-month **Mother Teresa Fellowship** programme at Ashoka University's *Centre for Social Impact and Philanthropy*. It allows you to pursue your goals in development by providing you mentorship, professional and personal support, along with a monthly stipend. YIF alumni have started national movements, built gender sensitization programs, shaped institutions that educate underprivileged communities, and empowered communities of farmers, among other pursuits focused on creating meaningful change in society.




Turn your Fellowship into a Master's Degree

Extend your stay at Ashoka by a year and graduate with a **Master of Arts in Liberal Studies** (MLS) degree. This interdisciplinary research program is open to Fellows and alumni, wherein students work with Ashoka University faculty as their thesis advisors. Several Fellows have used the MLS degree to pivot into completely new fields of study, and have thereafter gone on to successfully pursue varied professions or doctoral programs at leading institutions globally.



Pursue a Semester or Summer Abroad

Ashoka's academic collaborations give Fellows an opportunity to apply for an exchange programme at Sciences Po, Paris and a summer school at the Salzburg Global Media Academy. Fellows have also benefitted from application fee waivers for graduate degrees at University of Pennsylvania and HEC Paris. 




Countries where the Young India Fellowship community is located



Fellows are Civil Servants or have received recognition through National Awards





I approached the YIF application process with critical reflection and authenticity. Logistically, the process was smooth, but through the journey of writing essays and engaging interview conversations, I was more convinced that YIF was the right fit for me. I am yet to see an application form that gauges one's life journey with the wholeness that YIF does, which is why I say that irrespective of one's background, anyone can be a fit here. 

To apply to the YIF Class of 2024, you are required to have completed a recognized undergraduate degree or equivalent in any discipline, by July 2023 or earlier.
