About Child Rights Fellowship:

The Child Rights Fellowship is a strategic collaboration between Ashoka University and Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights (DCPCR), Government of NCT of Delhi to engage young professionals in transforming the lives of children in Delhi.

It aims to strengthen child welfare in Delhi via governance transformations and to provide fellows with a platform to work on reforms, policy implementation and government stakeholder engagement.

The Fellowship was launched in 2020 and within 2 years, the fellowship has made a landmark achievement by launching 10+ projects across 3 focus areas, Education, Health and Juvenile Justice.

The fellows get an opportunity to innovate interventions and leverage data to strengthen child welfare initiatives and resolve implementation bottle-necks. They work on-field in the assigned focus area for 1 year while receiving training, mentorship and support for professional development from government officers and the programme team at CRF.

Role and Responsibilities:

The role will be part of the core Program Management Unit (PMU) for the CRF program. This is a core government consultancy role in the social/development sphere of impact, focused on Child Rights. The candidate will be expected to lead projects end-to-end.

This would include:

- Conduct initial on-ground research to understand the problem statement, problem-solving, and designing effective solutions;
- Design work module and detailed guidelines for work to be undertaken by Fellows based on initial on-ground research and close collaboration with DCPCR and other relevant government stakeholders for the workpiece;
- Guide Fellows' work in the NCT of Delhi as per work module creation, and supporting them in executing and managing on ground stakeholders;
- Ensure high-quality outputs for the program;
- Evaluate and analyze Fellow submissions, and provide feedback and capacity building as and when required;
- Take the lead on synthesizing recommendations and best practices in close collaboration with the Fellows based on the work done;
- Manage ongoing stakeholder interaction with relevant government departments to facilitate the implementation of recommendations;
- Create implementation and monitoring & evaluation plans for your respective workpieces;
- Ongoing documentation of program best practices and work piece led by self;
- Manage administrative and operations responsibilities for the program, including logistics and planning for events.

Eligibility and Education Qualification:

- Minimum 3 years of experience in project management/consulting
- Bachelor's degree is mandatory.
- Master's degree in management/public policy/social work/public administration will be preferred.

Preferred Experience & Competencies:
